## BC MOTION PICTURE INDUSTRY BACKS WOMEN DIRECTORS: MPPIA WIDC FEATURE FILM AWARD WINNER ANNOUNCED

**Vancouver, Canada** – Creative Women Workshops Association (CWWA) and the Motion Picture Production Industry Association of BC (MPPIA) are pleased to announce the inaugural winner of a new award designed to encourage more feature films directed by women in British Columbia.

Director, writer and actress **Jacqueline Samuda** is the first recipient of the **MPPIA WIDC Feature Film Award**, set to be presented at the 2008 Spotlight Awards Gala in cooperation with Women in Film and Television – Vancouver (WIFT-Vancouver) on March 8 at 8 pm.

The award will support the completion of Samuda's comedy feature film project *Bread*. Valued at nearly \$100,000, the prestigious prize includes: in-kind rentals for one week at North Shore Studios, The Bridge, or Vancouver Film Studios; production equipment rentals from William F. White Ltd; and post production support from Deluxe Vancouver and Sharpe Sound Studios. In addition, BC Film has pledged a \$15,000 cash contribution towards the production of Samuda's first feature length production.

"For any filmmaker, the road from development to production can be a long one," says Samuda, who is also the current Chair of the Pacific Cinémathèque, and a past President of WIFT - Vancouver. "As a female filmmaker with some statistics to climb over, this is a real boost. I'm very grateful to MPPIA, to the Women In the Director's Chair (WIDC) program -- which has provided me with valuable training in the past -- and to all the sponsors."

"We are very pleased to support this award," affirms Peter Leitch, Chair of MPPIA and President, North Shore Studios. "It provides meaningful material support for Jacqueline as a director of her feature film project, and as a first of its kind award in Canada it represents industry leadership from some of the most significant companies in western Canada."

"Bread is a feel-good movie that pokes a bit of fun at the film industry and our struggles to stay connected in the hectic lives we lead. It will be a pleasure working with Jacqueline on the project," comments Carol Whiteman, Creative Women Workshops Association, President and CEO. "We'll be tracking the outcomes rippling forward from this award."

A director alumna of the 2002 Women In the Director's Chair Workshop, Jacqueline has made a positive imprint on the BC film and television industry as former president of Women In Film and Television-Vancouver and current Board chair of the Pacific Cinémathèque, and is the 2008 recipient of the Sharon Gibbon Lifetime Member Award for service to WIFT-V.

Jacqueline's Crazy 8's short film 50 QUESTIONS screened at the 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Vancouver Film Festival, the 2003 Whistler Independent Film Festival (Best Short Runner-Up), the 2004 inaugural Vidfest Video Festival and WIFT-Vancouver's 2004 Summer Shorts, and now airs on Movieola. Her short film LOOK screened at the 2003 Cineworks' Salon, as well as at the 2002 Reelfast Gala as a Top Ten and Best Editor award-winner.
