Kelly-Ruth has accumulated a variety of experiences in theatre, film, television, and in the music industry. Originally trained as an actor, Ms. Mercier holds an M.F.A. (Directing) and a B.A. (Acting). She continues to work as a performer, director, producer, singer, instructor, story editor and visual effects producer.

K-R has guest-starred on television in Showtime's The L Word, Lifetime's Past Sins, CTV's Robson Arms and Cold Squad, and CBC's Black Harbour. Other small screen appearances include Supernatural and I WANT TO MARRY RYAN BANKS (MOW);

big screen excursions include BATTLE IN SEATTLE, FANTASTIC FOUR 2, PAINT CANS, RED DEER, and BURIED ON SUNDAY. She has appeared on stage in 9 of Canada's 10 provinces.

Her film producing efforts STILL LIFE WITH SCISSORS, ONCE UPON A TIME ON THE BEACH and THE WATCHERS have been broadcast in Canada as well as having been screened at festivals in Europe, Asia and North America. Her most recent directing effort, 24/7, won a spot in Vancouver's Crazy 8's 2005 and premiered at the Ethics of Entertainment Film Festival (Phoenix); her short film UNFINISHED had its world premiere at the Atlanta Int'l Film Festival, June 2006.

She'll be back behind the camera early in 2007 with NO ONE KNOWS YOU LIKE YOUR MOTHER and MOVE OUT CLEAN, and will return to directing for the stage that spring with <u>The Monster Trilogy</u>.

Currently K-R is writing MOW's for a Vancouver production company, and continues with the development of the feature films THE BIGGER RISK, CHANGE OF OCCUPATION, and TAKEN IDENTITY as well as the feature doc's THE TIME TO MOTHER, INDICTMENT OF LIBERTY, TAKE A PILL and TRIAL BY VHS.

K-R served as Associate Producer on the broadcast documentary ROCK'N'ROLL KID (world premiere: Vancouver Int'l Film Festival, Sept 2006), and Post Supervisor on MISSING: SRI LANKA'S SILENT TSUNAMI (world premiere: Amnesty Int'l Film Festival, Vancouver, Nov 2006). She teaches Production Planning at the Art Institute of Vancouver and is a past instructor at the Vancouver Film School (Writing Dept), while continuing as a Guest Lecturer for Women in Film and Video Vancouver, and UBC. Kelly-Ruth chaired the 2006 Gemini Jury for Best Achievement in Visual Effects.

Kelly-Ruth lives in Vancouver with her partner & fiancé David Richmond-Peck – whom she met when he starred in her MFA Thesis production of <u>The Bacchae</u> – with their two energetic dogs, JoJo and Henry. Together, they jointly run their production company, Infinite Motion Pictures.
