Facilitating workshop sessions, providing personal coaching, publishing the annual WIDC newsletter and administering the WIDC awards and fellowships, Carol has helped advance the careers of hundreds of women screen directors, as well as actors and technicians across Canada and internationally

Carol holds a BFA with Honours from York University's Theatre Performance program and is a graduate of the Alliance Atlantis Banff Television Executive Program. She enjoys memberships in a variety of industry organizations, including ACCT, ACTRA, CAEA and Women In film where she is a member of the Atlantic and Toronto Chapters and a Life Member of the Vancouver Chapter. Currently serving on eight committees and advisory boards, she is particularly proud to be part of the Steering Committee for the BC Screen-based Media Industry Human Resources Project, a first ever effort to bring together Film & TV. 
